You need to contact all the different 9H prefixes from the list to be eligible for this award.

Copies of QSL cards (both sides if needed) must be submitted . You need eight ( 8 ) qsl cards confirmed to be eligible for this award. Cards should be verified.

The Name and Callsign will appear on the Award certificate. The award certificate shall be dated and serial numbered by mode ( PHONE #001, CW #001, DIGITAL MODES #001, MIXED #001).

Your callsign must be verifiable, either on an internet database like QRZ or HamCall.  
 Qso's after January 2000 are eligible for this Award. Bands eligible for this award : All Bands.

A fee of €10 for EU and Outside EU should accompany the application, to cover printing and mailing expenses for each award.

**Minimum information on each QSL:**

Full QSO details.

**Qso's that count (or do not count):**

Cross band Qso's are NOT counted . Qso's under authorizations other than amateur radio allocations are NOT counted.
